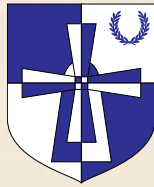

Book Review

Made by Hand: Searching for Meaning in a Throwaway World
by Mark Frauenfelder
241 pages, ISBN 978—59184-332-0

This might strike you as a odd choice for a pre-17th century newsletter; however so many of us in the SCA create things why not bring this into our mundane world too? We can put our hard won research skills to use in a different milieu. I have made several fancy vests for black tie functions along with matching bow ties. This was much cheaper than buying them and I could pick my favorite fabrics and funky buttons too!

I loved this book; it is an interesting story about the journeys from a consumer to a maker. Mark Frauenfelder, the author, is also the editor in Chief of Make magazine; however he himself did not make much. He tries several things from gardening, or killing his lawn, to bee keeping, using wild bees from other's and his own houses' infestations. Also, in the course of the story he and his family move several times and he has to improvise new ways to keep chickens when their new residence is in coyote country. His chapter titles are very funny for example chapter 5 Raising Baby Dinosaurs is about raising chickens! He also has a strong running thread throughout the book on reusing "scraps"; I so understand reusing of scraps, can you say contrasting facings on garb anyone?

My favorite chapters though were the introduction, Escape to Rorotona, the first, The Courage to Screw Things Up. and the last, Learning How to Learn. How often have we delayed a project for fear of it going badly? I have many have done projects just waiting for me to plow ahead... So long as they are sitting there uncompleted are they failures? Have I learned anything? The author takes this to the farthest extent as he and his family moved to a small island country, Rarotonga. They were beaten by not only tropical issues, i.e. disease, but by social isolation and so moved back in a few months. This was the start of him and his family learning how to make things as you were forced to in that place. The last chapter talks about education and our schools. Perhaps having a education degree and being a lifelong learning endears me to this subject. His suggestions, in part, boil down to more hands on learning. Speaking from experience I love the SCA for this teaching method is most often used by us and works very well for me.

In conclusion, much like our Deadly Carnival event, let's try something new! If screwing up is holding you back in making something ask around we are a diversity talented group. Make a mock up of your project maybe using cheaper materials or on a smaller scale. Helping out in the kitchen can be a great way to learn some new skills too. Let's not have another event with only two items in the A&S completion.

The Importance of the Test Feast

With assistance from Lord Fridrich Flußmüllner

When you are preparing to be a kitchen steward or "feast-o-crat," the greatest favor you can do for yourself is to have a test feast. We usually do ours about a month out. It is important not to do this too far out from the date you will be cooking, or your prices may no longer be correct for figuring plate costs. Here are some tips:

Who to invite to the test feast?

Correct number per table (8 or 10 usually)

For a dinner you can multiply by the number of tables

For a lunch board you can multiply by expected number of diners

Wide variety of palates

This will create the variety that will attend the feast itself

Choose at least on very picky person!

Cook as you will for the real thing

As much as you want to, don't eat the test feast. This will give you the change to test your timings and the amount of work you need to do for each course. You know you like the food, that's why you're cooking it! Allow this to be a chance to get other people's opinions. As you are cooking, make sure to make notes on your diner's comments and all those little changes you make as you go. This way you will have those for when you try to re-create that delicious item.

Prep work is vital

Anything that can be done ahead – DO IT!
Baking, chopping, marinating, grinding, this is great work for volunteers

Here's where the math comes in:

Once you have figured all of your items as shown below, you can come up with the total cost for your feast. If it's below your budget, wonderful! If not, you'll need to start cutting costs.

Item: Bread (2 per table)

Recipe	Cost
1 c. white flour	.10 (x2) = .20
2 c. wheat flour	.17 (x2) = .34
1 t. baking powder	.13 (x2) = .26
1 t. baking soda	.10 (x2) = .20
1 t. salt	.01 (x2) = .02
2 T. butter	.20 (x2) = .40
1 ½ c. buttermilk	.21 (x2) = .42

The total cost per table:
\$1.84

The total cost for feast (10 tables): \$18.40

Things like baking powder will need to be bought whole, so you will need to take the total cost of the item and divide the cost over all the tables. For example, a box of baking powder costs \$1.25, broken over your 10 tables, equals .13. You will also need to round up to whole bags on things like flour and sugar, so take that into account on your final totals for the whole feast. Remember, that you might be able to use that extra flour or salt in other items in your feast.

Useful Information

Some useful measurements:

1 lb. flour = 4 cups
1 lb. sugar = 2 cups
1 tablespoon (tbsp) = 3 teaspoons (tsp)
1 pint (pt) = 2 cups
1 quart (qt) = 2 pints
16 cups = 1 gallon

¾ lb. (12 oz.) meat per person for dinner (total, not each course!)

Applesauce makes a great substitute for eggs when baking! 1 egg = 3 T. applesauce
It will be more dense, not as light and fluffy, but is delicious.

Use white pepper instead of black or red pepper to avoid allergies.

Don't forget to figure in drinks in the overall cost of your feast. While serving water is not period, many people will prefer it. Coffee and tea are also always popular, although not period. For a more period option, spiced wine or cider is an excellent choice.

Another item to figure in your budget are condiments. If you are serving a pork, find a mustard recipe to make. If you are serving bread, flavored butters (herb, cheese, honey, garlic) or fruit compotes are a wonderful addition.

Look for things you can use multiple times in one feast to save money

- Spice with a theme - salt, pepper, saffron, cinnamon,
- Bake extra bread to make your own breadcrumbs

Comparison shop to save more and buy in bulk! Maines, BJ's, and Sam's Club are great.
