OFFICER REPORTS

** Baron & Baroness - His Excellency Edward notes that this is the last business meeting before they step down. Also, They had a great time at Yule and hopes everyone else did too. Yngvar thanks their Excellencies for their service. Their Incipencies say that they are looking forward to Seven Deadlies and are looking forward to stepping up and working with everyone. If you have any thoughts, please feel free to talk to Fergus and Helene.

** Pursuivant - Alheydis says that some heraldry has recently passed. Next month she is stepping down and Olivia will be stepping up. If you know that any changes are needed or someone needs to be added to the OP, please let Olivia know. Yngvar asks how to remove someone from the OP. Yngvar thanks Rian for picking up the marshaling last night.

** Fencing Marshal - Helene says that fencing is also happening at the same time last as heavy weapons. There was a tournament last night and Rian won. Desi has the very last Delftwood sticker for \$1 and 11 magnets for \$5 each. She also says that there is nothing on the schedule for this month's newcomer's class. Next month Alheydis will teach heraldry "stuff".

Lady Helene's Garden

January 2013: Fun with Food Coloring

"Dried marigold flowers were a stock household medicine and were also useful for cooking in winter, when there were no fresh flowers. They were put into stews and pottages as a sort of petal pepper, rubbed into cheese to keep its colour bright, and sugared into a conserve which was both delicious and effacious against the plague." (McLean, p. 142)

I'm having fun with experimenting! After taking a class on sotelties led by Delftwood's own Lady Lijsbet and reading her handout of the lovely Tournaments Illuminated article by Elsie Fleming, I noticed that marigolds could be used for coloring sugar paste.

I wondered what sort of color they would produce, particularly since the article mentioned needing to add saffron. I ground some of my dried marigold flowers into powder using a mortar, which took a bit of time. I wanted to know what color it would produce on its own, so I made a simple glaze using confectioners' sugar and water. Using the recommendation of equal parts sugar and ground marigold, I started with 1 teaspoon of each. I found the color very intense, so added an additional teaspoon of sugar. The color was still very bright and yellowish orange. I'm not sure that saffron would need to be added, at least in the glaze.

The taste is not to a modern palate at all! It is

sweet, but leaves a rather bitter aftertaste. You can definitely taste the marigold!

Looking through Ms. Flemin's bibliography, I found "Delights for Ladies" by Sir Hugh Plat, published in 1609, which has a recipe for making sugar paste that taste and smell like flowers. The site upon which the recipe is transcribed is no longer active, but I found it through the Internet Archive.

"14. A way to make Sugerplate both of colour and taste of any flower.

Take violets, and beat them in a mortar with a little hard sugar; then put into it a sufficient quantitie of Rose-water; then lay your gum in steep in the water, and so work it into paste: and so will your paste be both of the colour of the violet, and of the smell of the violet. In like sort you may worke with Marigold, Cowslips, Primroses, Buglosse, or any other flower." (Plat)

Now I wonder if marigold could be used as the coloration in paint. The possibilities are endless!
