A Medieval Pie Contest!

Baroness Clarice's Pie Crust Receptie

Many people have asked for my recipe for the allergy-friendly pie crusts I made at Lijsbet's request for her feast at Delftwood Yule. Here it is! This recipe works with any basic GF flour blend, available for purchase at the grocery or health food store. If you need help making a custom flour blend, please seek me out at meeting or via email at clariceroan@aol.com.

Gluten Free Pie Crust for Savory Pies

2 $\frac{3}{4}$ cups gluten free flour blend (choose one that includes guar gum or similar)
1/2 tsp sea salt
1 $\frac{1}{3}$ cups chilled all-vegetable shortening, cut into small pieces
2/3 cup ice water

In food processor, pulse flour and salt. Add cubes of shortening and pulse until coarse crumbs form. Slowly add ice water, alternating with pulsing, until dough comes together, and water is absorbed. Divide dough batch into 2 pieces, wrap with saran wrap, and freeze about 15 minutes, until firm.

Roll dough between sheets of wax paper. (You may need to flour dough inside wax paper.) Roll until it will cover 9 inch pie plate. You can invert pie plate onto dough and flip over while dough is still on wax paper. Gently peel off wax paper, and press dough into pie plate, using extra dough as patches if needed. Add filling. (Filling should be at room temp or cooler, or it will affect the integrity of your pie crust.) Roll out top crust as above. Flip it onto your hand gently and roll onto pie, removing wax paper as you place it.

You can either bake crust at 400 degrees for 30 minutes and then add filling for open pie, or you can add cold filling and bake pie with top crust as directed by pie recipe, depending on your preference.

Notes: There are many excellent GF flour blends available. I prefer to make my own, as I often tailor it to my intended audience, depending on the allergies of the audience. I found the cookbook "Cooking For Isaiah" to be an invaluable reference, and use the all-purpose GF flour blend as my basic recipe, substituting flours when applicable. (For instance, many people who are GF also need to avoid corn, potato or both. This means I need to avoid the xanthan gum and potato starch in this recipe.)

There will be opportunities to test your arms on our thrown weapons ranges. There are axes to loan. We will be determining our next thrown weapons champion with an exciting throw for all to enjoy!

There will be merchants on site to browse. If you wish to merchant, there is no fee other than the standard site fees. Please Contact Radulfr Eriksson if you are interested in merchanting. Please keep in mind that the site does not provide anything.

Show off your A&S skills for all to see. Our competition this year is a tribute to heraldry. All entries must be of wood or leather craft and featuring heraldic talent. There will be prizes for local artisan as well as best overall entrant.

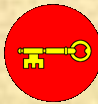
