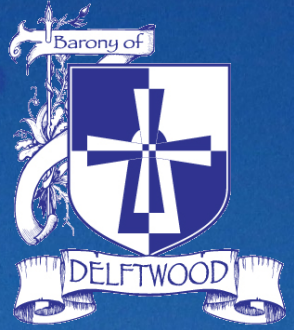

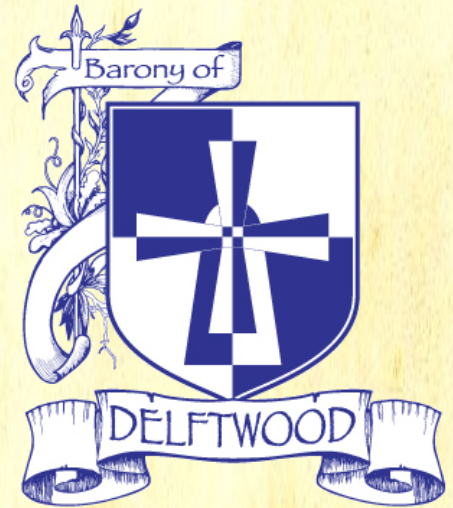

# Baroness Helene's Garden

### June 2013: A Salad of Herbs

*"All kitchen gardeners grew kale of one sort or another, which cannot be said of any other vegetable outside the allium family." (MacLean, p. 207)*

Many years ago, Lady Lijsbet created a feast, and utilized the recipe "Salat" from a *Forme of Cury*. The salad called for many different kinds of herbs, spinach, many plants from the onion family, and a simple oil and vinegar dressing. I never really considered parsley a salad vegetable, nor many other herbs. The salad Lady Lijsbet made was delightful, but there wasn't much need to chop or tear up the herbs as indicated in the recipe.

This was before a warm and moist spring in my garden. As the temperatures increased in April and May, many of my herbs returned, and started growing very quickly. The recent rains and sunshine have only increased this process. I was startled by how large the leaves were on the parsley and sage. This is far from the varieties that can be found in the grocery store or the garnishes used in restaurants. These leaves would definitely need to be torn up before using them in a salad. In fact, many of the herbs are ready for an initial harvest to start them drying.

Also, earlier in the season, I planted seeds for spinach, kale, and radishes. I was eager to grow some types of leafy greens that would have been found in medieval English kitchen gardens. The plants liked the cool temperatures, have germinated, and are starting to grow into recognizable plants.

Conveniently enough, Lady Lijsbet announced a challenge to bring a period, seasonal dish to a pot luck. With the way my garden is grown, the salat certainly fit the bill.

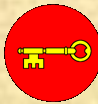
