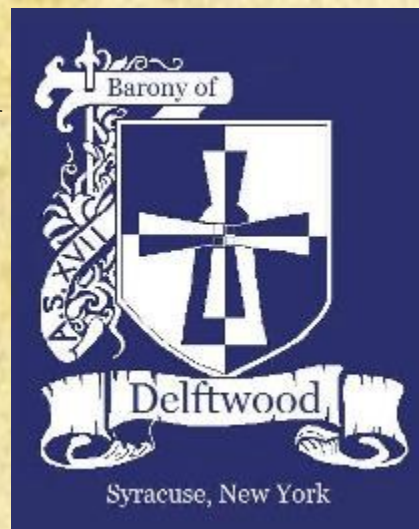

Youth Fighter Gear Wishlist

Youth Fencing

Division 1 (6-9 years)

- *12K fencing masks appropriately sized
- *Medium weight leather gorgets or equivalent (blue foam padding) sized appropriately
- *Cloth or leather gloves that fit correctly
- *Weapons: Uses Plastic size 0 or 3 foil available here

Division 2 (10-13 years)

- *Puncture resistant “ghost jacket”, doublet, etc. covering torso, shoulders, and armpits (may be covered with gores sewn in the shirt)
- *12k fencing masks appropriately sized
- *Abrasion resistant gloves of correct sizes
- *Padded gorget with cervical protection (rigid construction, metal or leather)
- *Weapons:
 1. 35” foil or epee
 2. Dagger 25” or less conforming to standard light weapons standards

Division 3 (13-17 years)

- *Clothing is the same as Division 2
- *Weapons:
 1. 35” foil or epee
 2. 35” rapier or less
 3. Dagger 25” or less

Shields

Shields for all three divisions may be made wood, plastic, or metal. Edges must be covered by either leather, tubing, foam or rubber. Shields may no more than 315” total area

Youth Heavy Weapons:

Division 1 (6-9 years)

Helmets: Acceptable helmets for youth combat include:

street hockey helmets, hockey helmets, baseball catcher’s masks, fencing masks with full head protection and Period looking metal helms.

- *All helmets must have grills or metal mesh covering the face.
- *No opening on the face shall be more than 1.5 inches.
- *The helmet must be constructed of rigid material.
- *Helmets must have either a chinstrap or a back strap to hold the helm securely.

Neck: Light leather or ½ inch closed cell foam is required to cover the neck, larynx and cervical vertebra.

Torso: Kidney, sternum and xiphoid protection are required, with at least of ½ inch closed cell foam.

Padding: Elbows and knees require minimum soft padding, hard shell preferred.

Weapons: ¾ or 1” O.D. shaved rattan is the standard for all youth fighting. All weapons are covered with a minimum of 3/8” closed cell foam padding.

Division 2 (10-13 years)

Head: Same as Division 1

Neck: Medium (8 to 10 oz.) leather is required to cover the neck, larynx and cervical vertebra.

Torso: Same as Division 1, shoulder protection is recommended as is breast protection for females.

Elbows and Knees: Hard plastic, leather or metal over padding is required

Hands: Hockey gloves with rigid thumb or full gauntlets (plastic or metal) are required for hands

Division 3 (13-17 years)

Same as Division 2 except for torso requirements.

Torso: Torso requirements are the same as Division 2 except: Minimum medium leather backed with padding or foam. Kydex, metal scale, plate etc. are acceptable.

Dirty Dozen Derby Results

Delftwood's "First Annual Dirty Dozen Largesse Donation Derby" or 4D, was held at this year's Tournament of the Windmill (TOTW). We had five entrants that created amazing period replicas of items that could have come to us from the past, via a time machine. Their entries did not disappoint, and when all was said and done, The Barony received nearly 60 hand crafted largesse items.

I would like to thank the following artisans for their hard work, and credit them for making our first 4D such an incredible success with their magnificent entries. There will be a gallery feature in the August A&S Special Edition Issue displaying all the submissions. The pictures do NOT do them justice....

THL Svanna in Kyrra entered 12 intricately knitted reliquary bags and pouches, all of different sizes, with period patterns and colors.

Illaria of Delftwood presented us with 12 Italian Renaissance pearl earrings nestled in matching silk reliquary pouches.

Baroness Helene al-Zarqa' crafted 12 – 6th century English, spiral-wire rings in gold-tone (brass) and silver.

Wylde Wyse fashioned 12 miniature sewing baskets, each containing a tapestry needle book, 3 wooden thread winders, and 4 antler buttons, all hand made and carved.

Our last entry was by Lord Jarrah ibn Balshazzar al Hamadani. He presented 12 goblet/cup covers, fashioned from cotton doilies trimmed with various glass and crystal beads.

The entries were judged by our King and Queen and our Baron and Baroness as well as the populace on hand. The Royals chose Wylde's sewing kits as their winner. However, the Populace vote was a close race, with only a total of six counters separating first place and third place. Our winner... Lord Jarrah's goblet/cup covers. There was also the presentation of King and Queen's favorite choices and they went to Illaria for her Italian earrings and bags; followed by Wylde with her sewing kits.

My thanks go out to Baroness Helene, for her encouragement for this, our maiden effort at 4D. There is a potential new A&S site – the Cicero Fire Department said we could use one of their halls. The best day for them is Tuesdays. They have never done a regular meeting arrangement before. Thrown Weapons

Lanen says that people are throwing weapons and Tuesday has been going great! There are a couple new throwers every week and that returning throwers are coming. Atlatl and spear will be this weekend at Wildwood and we have lots of new targets.

Youth Marshal

Edward does not have much to report. He did price out shaved rattan at War Practice at \$20/stick, but he is not sure if that vendor will be at Pennsic. There is another vendor has \$10/stick, which will make 2 swords. The padding at Home Depot is fairly inexpensive/. \$50 can set up 2-3 swords. Felicity requests that we get some swords, since it is under \$100. Edward states that we could possibly do a bulk rattan order to save some money. For the record, rattan for youth is 1" and everyone else is 1.25". Additionally, Baron Fergus hooked Edward up with some items for Youth Fighting gear.

Minister of Lists

Amalie states that there is a tourney on June 14. Thank you to Edward for MOLing the Tournament last month. The winner of last month's tourney was Ruslan.

Anastasia was warranted as an MOL at War Practice. There will be lots of MOL opportunities at Tournament of the Windmill. Come learn and help out!

Chatelaine

Via Felicity: Margaret reminds everyone that there is a demo at Liverpool Library on July 17 from 6-8:30 pm. There will be a discussion meeting after the business meeting tonight to see who is coming & what people are bringing. Lady Lijsbet is heading up the YMCA demo. After the meeting there will be a discussion for that, too. This demo is July 18.

Margaret will be keeping the job of chatelaine but Catalina will step up as the email contact. The help is very welcomed.

Chamberlain

Finnr states that stuff is resting comfortably. There has not been a dedicated day for inventory, but he is going through things an hour and tote at a time. He is prepping for Windmill Tournament.

Crown Tournament Bid Status

Banner project

Finner & Felicity had talked about repurposing the PVC from ½ of the current list field stands. Then we would have specific gear for indoors and outdoors.

Baroness Helene asks that we make sure we scavenge from the dying stands and not from the other ones.

Marcus wants to thank Edward for creating the list field stands. No one had realized they were going to be kept outside, which caused some to breakdown quicker than they should have.

Baron Fergus would like to move that we repurpose the stands falling apart and keep the good ones. Vote: all in favor, no opposed, no abstentions.

New Business

Cyneric asks about the next Officers' meeting date, as it would be July 3. Do we want to delay meeting by one week? Felicity states, after some discussion, the meeting will remain on the 3rd. Cyneric will not be at this meeting. Please get a hold of him if you need a check.
