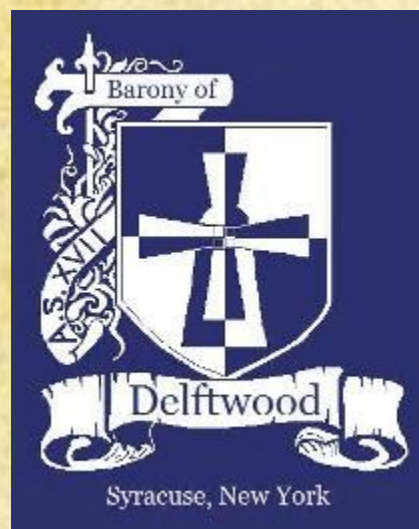

Youth Fighter Gear Wishlist

Youth Fencing

Division 1 (6-9 years)

- *12K fencing masks appropriately sized
- *Medium weight leather gorgets or equivalent (blue foam padding) sized appropriately
- *Cloth or leather gloves that fit correctly
- *Weapons: Uses Plastic size 0 or 3 foil available here

Division 2 (10-13 years)

- *Puncture resistant “ghost jacket”, doublet, etc. covering torso, shoulders, and armpits (may be covered with gores sewn in the shirt)
- *12k fencing masks appropriately sized
- *Abrasion resistant gloves of correct sizes
- *Padded gorget with cervical protection (rigid construction, metal or leather)
- *Weapons:
 1. 35” foil or epee
 2. Dagger 25” or less conforming to standard light weapons standards

Division 3 (13-17 years)

- *Clothing is the same as Division 2
- *Weapons:
 1. 35” foil or epee
 2. 35” rapier or less
 3. Dagger 25” or less

Shields

Shields for all three divisions may be made wood, plastic, or metal. Edges must be covered by either leather, tubing, foam or rubber. Shields may no more than 315” total area

Youth Heavy Weapons:

Division 1 (6-9 years)

Helmets: Acceptable helmets for youth combat include:

street hockey helmets, hockey helmets, baseball catcher’s masks, fencing masks with full head protection and Period looking metal helms.

- *All helmets must have grills or metal mesh covering the face.
- *No opening on the face shall be more than 1.5 inches.
- *The helmet must be constructed of rigid material.
- *Helmets must have either a chinstrap or a back strap to hold the helm securely.

Neck: Light leather or ½ inch closed cell foam is required to cover the neck, larynx and cervical vertebra.

Torso: Kidney, sternum and xiphoid protection are required, with at least of ½ inch closed cell foam.

Padding: Elbows and knees require minimum soft padding, hard shell preferred.

Weapons: ¾ or 1” O.D. shaved rattan is the standard for all youth fighting. All weapons are covered with a minimum of 3/8” closed cell foam padding.

Division 2 (10-13 years)

Head: Same as Division 1

Neck: Medium (8 to 10 oz.) leather is required to cover the neck, larynx and cervical vertebra.

Torso: Same as Division 1, shoulder protection is recommended as is breast protection for females.

Elbows and Knees: Hard plastic, leather or metal over padding is required

Hands: Hockey gloves with rigid thumb or full gauntlets (plastic or metal) are required for hands

Division 3 (13-17 years)

Same as Division 2 except for torso requirements.

Torso: Torso requirements are the same as Division 2 except: Minimum medium leather backed with padding or foam. Kydex, metal scale, plate etc. are acceptable.

New Business

The discussion for tonight will be: (1) to hold 2nd Thursday of month be held at LeMoyné and the other weeks at Rockefeller, (2) to move storage & fight practice to Rockefeller, and (3) give more donations and do fundraising to help with costs.
